EMPLOYMENT ROSE 1.8% IN FAIRFIELD COUNTY AREA IN 2014

- Payrolls rose at a 1.8% pace in the Bridgeport-Stamford Labor Market Area last year, as 7,500 jobs were added.
- Leading the gains were trade, transportation and utilities (+3,500), professional and business services (+2,000) and state & local government (+1,400).
- Financial activities lost the most jobs last year (-1,400), with the majority of these jobs in the securities sector.

LOCAL UNEMPLOYMENT FALLS TO 5.3%


- The Bridgeport-Stamford LMA unemployment rate declined to 5.3% in December, its lowest level since June 2008.
- The December rate was 0.5% lower than in November and 1% lower than one year ago.
- from the prior month, but slightly higher than the local rate.


• At 5.4%, the nation's unemployment rate was down slightly 6.0%

BUILDING PERMITS FALL

- There were permits approved for 1,747 new residential units in the Fairfield County area during 2014, a decline of 23% from 2013.
- This was the lowest number of building permits since 2011.
- Statewide, the number of permits fell 8%, to 5,297 last year.
