



New York City Unemployment Rate Falls Below 9%

- In December, New York City's unemployment rate fell to 8.9%, down from 9.1% the prior month.
- This was the city's lowest unemployment rate since April 2009, and marked the sixth straight month New York City had a lower rate than the nation.
- Unemployment fell in New York City in 11 of 12 months during 2010, and ended the year 1.6% lower than where it started.



City Employment Up 1.1% in 2010

- New York City added 41,800 jobs in 2010, a 1.1% gain from the year before.
- Private sector jobs rose by 50,800, their largest increase since 2007.
- Gains were led by professional and business services (+17,200) and education and health services (+16,200).
- Not surprisingly, job losses were led by local government, which shed 6,200 workers.



Manhattan Buildings Permits at Lowest Level Since 1994

- In 2010, permits were issued for just 704 new housing units in Manhattan, the lowest figure since 1994.
- This was a 48% decline from 2009, and was 93% lower than 2008.
- Although permits in Brooklyn were up sharply from 2009, they remained 84% below 2008's level.



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
