


# NYC Unemployment Rate at 18 Month Low

- New York City's unemployment rate fell to 9.2% in October, its lowest reading since April 2009.
- After peaking at 10.5% at the end of 2009, the city's unemployment rate has fallen in 9 of the past 10 months.
- The national rate remained at 9.6%, marking the fourth straight month the city's rate has been lower than the nation's.

# City Employment Rises by 41,600


- NYC employment rose by 41,600 during the twelve months ending October 2010.
- Professional and business services added the most jobs,
- Education and health services payrolls continued to grow,
- The biggest decline continued to be in local government, which shed 10,200 workers.





### Manhattan Permits Remain at Low Levels

- Through September, permits have been issued for only 668 new residential units in Manhattan, 44% lower than a year ago, and 93% lower than the same period in 2008.
- While Brooklyn permits are running 45% higher than 2009, they remain 89% below 2008's level.


