NYC's Unemployment Rate Falls Again

- New York City's unemployment rate declined to 9.3% in September, lower than the national rate of 9.6%.
- Unemployment has fallen in 8 of the first 9 months of 2010 in New York City.
- A year ago, the unemployment rate in NYC was 10.3%.



City Employment Up 25,000 Over Past Year

- Employment in New York City rose by 25,400 from September 2009 to September 2010.
- Education and health services continued to add jobs, with employment in this sector up 11,000.
- For the second straight month, employment grew in financial activities compared to a year ago.
- Local government shed the most jobs, with employment 5,900 less than during September of 2009.



Building Permits Plummet In Manhattan

- Through the first eight months of 2010, permits have been issued for only 492 new residential units in Manhattan, with none filed in July and August.
- This figure is 56% below the same period in 2009, and 94% below 2008's comparable period.
- The lack of permit filings point to very little new construction in Manhattan over the next few years.
