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NYC Job Growth Remains Strong

- There were 95,800 jobs added in New York City from September 2011-September 2012, a gain of 2.5%.
- The biggest increases continue to be posted by professional and business services (+44,700), leisure and hospitality (+18,700) and education and health services (+12,900).
- Financial activities and the federal government shed the most jobs over the past year, with each posting a 1,200 decline in employment.

U.S. Economy Grows at a 2% Pace in the Third Quarter

- Gross domestic product, which measures the value of all goods and services produced in the U.S., rose at a 2.0% annual rate in the third quarter.
- This was slightly higher than expected, and up from the 1.3% rate of the second quarter.
- Economic growth has remained timid in 2012 after a strong fourth quarter of 2011.

Inflation Remains Tame in NYC Area

- The consumer price index increased 1.6% for the 12 months ending September in the New York-Northern NJ-Long Island area.
- This was lower than the national increase of 2.0%.
- Shelter, food and gasoline were the biggest contributors to inflation over the past year.
